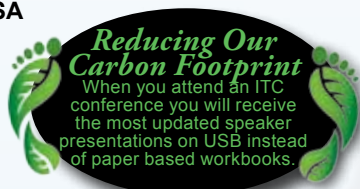

The National Institute for Crime Prevention and the Reintegration of Offenders (NICRO) joined forces with the South Africa Breweries (SAB) to launch a unique alcohol and road offences initiative which tackles the challenges of drunk driving at several levels.

The alcohol and road offences initiative, which is being piloted in and around Cape Town, will dramatically reduce the workload and lessen the burden on the formal criminal justice system, in addition to having a positive influence on reducing drunk driving and keeping South Africans safe on the roads. The programme seeks to change the behaviour and attitudes of the offender with respect to Driving Under the Influence.

This workshop will unpack the framework behind the programme, and look at how this can be implemented in the various provinces.
